

Why I joined Mensa

When I was in elementary school they gave us a test. The principal told me I had the highest score in the school, and was at the 99.9% level. By my junior year, school was something to sleep through. I did solve an "unsolvable" math problem in 6th grade, and was fascinated by the math of space travel. I also had a learning disability in writing, but that was overcome by the end of my senior year of college.

After finishing college I was contacted by someone who wanted me to do math for rockets. I declined, as I was busy with other things, mostly because my life was upside down and inside out from not fitting in. Always an outsider and never acknowledging it, I finally found a place in aerospace engineering. I also found an understanding of theology and philosophy after earning a degree in theology.

After two accidents, which landed me in the hospital, I had time to rethink life. Among other things, I found Mensa. That offered the hope of meeting interesting people to fit in with. There was not much of a spiritual rebirth at this time, as that had happened earlier, but the debates in Mensa did help sharpen my understanding of spiritual things, and helped me to explain them better to others. At first I was a bit intimidated and did not know what to think of the new people there, but they were welcoming and soon I fit in.

Primarily, I joined for the meetings and am happy with them and the people I meet there. I do not understand the purpose of Mensa without the meetings unless someone just wants the card.
