A Thought About Robots

If you missed our July Program Meeting, you missed an interesting one. It was about Isaac Asimov and his writings. A lot of time was spent on his "Three Laws of Robotics," the laws he thought robots should follow. I'd like to comment on those laws, or more correctly, one of those laws.

I very much disagree with his first law: A robot may not injure a human being or, through inaction, allow a human being to come to harm. To me this smacks of American upbringing, what we now call political correctness.

Think about the current "Terminator" series of movies that have been out in the last several years. There are multiple robots
