- The Name and Logo ad hoc Committee issued a statement regarding expression of opinion when speaking as an official part of Mensa. It was put on American Mensa Hospitality and American Mensa Firehouse websites. The statement was not final – it was put out

Flag Day

June 14 is national Flag Day. On that day in 1777 the design on the cover with 13 stripes and 13 stars, supposedly made by Betsy Ross, was chosen.

160 years later a contest was held to create a Wichita flag, with a prize of \$40. The winner is shown on the last page.

The white circle with 12 emanating lines on the Wichita flag is an Indian symbol for home. The red and white rays mean you can leave and return freely.

An amendment was proposed in 1940 to add the word WICHITA in white letters on the large red ray but was never voted on.
