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

November's Guest Speaker: Our own Larry Paarmann.



For our November Program Meeting, Larry D. Paarmann, our own LocSec, gave a review with a little bit of analysis of Dan Brown's most recent novel, *Origin*. Brown is one of the most successful authors alive today, having written a number of very popular novels, including *The Da Vinci Code*, *Angels & Demons*, and *Inferno*, all three of which have been made into popular movies. In *Origin*, Edmond Kirsch, the world's greatest authority on Artificial Intelligence (AI), is assassinated while in the middle of revealing to a world-wide audience his recent findings about the future of mankind. Eventually, Kirsch's message is transmitted around the world, and it has to do with the growth of AI until it absorbs humanity and becomes the new dominant species on earth.



Ah, December, all that election to-do is done with and we can get on with being sane and having a life. Well, except for in Mensa. Many of our Local Groups have **Nomination Committees** now seeking candidates for next year's officer positions. If they come to you, please say, "Yes." The more you put into Mensa, the more you'll get out of it – fun, growth, and the satisfaction of a job well done.

American Mensa is looking for candidates, too, but there's no NomComm. Instead we now use the petition system. Any member of American Mensa can apply to be a candidate for any of the elective positions. If you've got Internet connectivity, the good news is that the **2019 petition and election process** has been moved online. If you don't have access to the Internet, that's also the bad news – you can obtain paper copies from the National Office but. The whole procedure is laid out online at us.mensa.org/lead/amc/elections/2019-board-election/. Links to the forms are there, too, and they can be filled in and returned electronically.

Except for the **Candidate Signatures Petition** form. People actually have to put ink to paper for that one – 100 signatures if you're running for RVC, 250 if you're running for any of the other offices. But even the petitions can be downloaded, signed, scanned and uploaded, or mailed in if that's what works better for you.

Start with the **Candidate Checklist**, a nicely constructed step-by-step roadmap that tells you what needs to be done by when. I'll be happy to answer any questions you might have and give you whatever help you need along the way, especially if you're in a paper-only situation. Heck, I'll even sign your petition – Greg and I each signed the other's when we ran against each other two years ago.

Quick report on the **October AMC tele-meeting**. Discussion was spirited but civil as we worked through several issues. Your 2019 ballot will include several proposed amendments to the Bylaws. Probably the most important was produced by the Event Safety Task Force. It clarifies what had been an ambiguous and clunky process to address problems created by Mensans who don't behave well. Consider it closely when you vote (online or on paper) in April.

The sort of feeling not warm and reassuring like a mother lovingly caressing her baby, nor cold like the enmity of the stranger. That would imply judgement and subjectivity. It cannot be analyzed, described or labeled, it is a feeling that simply is.

Suddenly a vague inkling intrudes upon the solace of eternity. You realize that you exist. Nothing concrete mind you, simply a sort of understanding without actually knowing.
